

St Barnabas CE VC Primary Projected School Sports Premium Funding

In April 2013 the government announced new funding of £150 million for PE and Sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded primary schools. A typical primary school will receive £9,250 over the academic year.

School are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

At St Barnabas we are committed to ensuring our children understand the importance of being active, having a healthy lifestyle and enjoy sports and games activities. To guarantee that expenditure is sustainable we ensure that staff are skilled at delivering our scheme of work and that where sports professionals are employed that staff work closely with these individuals to continue to develop their skills in sports coaching.
